

KSRA BB GUN CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH STRUCTURE

The Kansas State Rifle Association will sponsor a BB Gun Championship Match to be used as a qualifying match to the Daisy National BB Gun Championship Match. The Match will follow the most current copy of the NRA 5 Meter BB Gun Rule book.

The goal is to have the Match move to a new location yearly and the location will be decided by KSRA after requests to host have been received. Deadline for the application to host will be August 1 of the year preceding the Match. KSRA will then select the host at their October Board Meeting and the host will be notified by December of the year prior to the Match. The match will be held between January 1 and April 1 each year. These dates coincide with NRA BB Gun Sectional dates in case the Match serves a dual purpose.

The hosts will provide the location, date and all materials to be used for the Match. The hosts will reimburse KSRA for the copying of the tests and test materials. The hosts will provide meals for each registered youth participating in the Match and two coaches per team registered. The host will provide to KSRA their itemized budget for the Match to include the charges to each team for registration.

The Range facility will be capable of providing firing points for a minimum of 25 teams with a minimum width of four feet. If the facility is capable of five foot firing points for the number of teams registered, the firing points will be a minimum of five foot or larger if available with all points being of equal width. Firing points will be drawn for upon registration at the match and the host team will draw for their firing point/points last.

All participants will be assigned a competitor number to be used on their test and targets.

Shooters will take a 50 question true/false and multiple choice test worth 100 points. The test will be provided by representatives of KSRA the morning of the Match. Test scores will be added to the shooting scores for team and individual aggregate awards. Youth receiving 100% on the test will be recognized and receive a certificate of accomplishment. Testing area must be near the range.

The course of fire will be prone, standing, sitting and kneeling with 10 minutes allowed for ten record shots and unlimited sighting shots per position. All relays will complete the prone position, then standing, sitting and kneeling. The score will be 100 points per shooting position plus the test for a total aggregate score of 500 points.

Host team may choose between the AR4-10 or the Orion electronic BB Gun targets and scoring system. If the AR4-10 is used the scoring will be performed as per the Daisy National BB Gun Championship Match program from 2012. In that case, one scorer must be provided per firing point by the firing team. A scoring room must be provided for near the range.

Teams will consist of five regular team members and two alternate team members to be designated at registration. Registration information will be sent to potential teams not less than 30 days prior to the match with a deadline for return of not less than 14 days prior to the Match. Host team will notify KSRA of the number of tests needed no less than 10 days prior to the Match.

Awards will be given to the top five individuals in each shooting position and aggregate for both team members and team alternates. Awards will be given to the top three teams.

The host team will be responsible for sending all results to KSRA within 30 days of the match. A Word document will be provided which will include those receiving 100% on the written test, the top **three** individuals in each category as recognized in the Award ceremony and photos of the top three teams sent as **.jpeg files with captions identifying the teams** for publication in the KSRA Chips-n-Ricochets. **New for 2014 the Host will be responsible**

for writing an article about the Match for the KSRA Chips-n-Ricochets. This article will include: the date and location of the match, the number of teams participating, the number of youth participating, the top three teams to include the team name and county or town represented, youths' names, coaches' names and the team aggregate score. Also to be included are the names of the top three youth in each position and aggregate, their team and town/county, and scores for both the team member and team alternate matches. The youth scoring 100% on the test should be named and their team and town/county should be included. Include when applicable, the web site where all match results can be found. This must be sent to KSRA via e-mail as a Word document within 30 days of the KSRA BB Gun Championship Match.

The host team will provide to the top three teams KSRA Foundation Grant Application Forms and instructions for assistance in attending the Daisy National BB Gun Championship Match. KSRA will provide \$500.00 per team to the top three teams from the KSRA BB Gun Championship Match to the DNGGBCM if they apply and are approved for a grant. Grant applications must be received by May 15.

It is the responsibility of the host to have a signed RELEASE, WAIVER, INDEMNIFICATION, HOLD HARMLESS, AND ASSUMPTION OF THE RISK AGREEMENT for each individual firing in the match. The **original hard copy** liability waivers must be **sent via regular postal mail** to the KSRA no later than 30 days after the match takes place.
